


400 YEARS IN THE MAKING

The mission of the Dover400th committee is to honor our past, celebrate our present, and to inspire our future through meaningful and creative community engagement. 2018 - 2023

GOALS:

- Educate and inform the local community and beyond regarding Dover's 400 year history as a settlement
- Identify and highlight the rich diversity and cultures that comprise the community.
- Obtain feedback from all stakeholders (business, government, demographics, diversity). Avoid becoming a forum for social or political activism.
- Plan and conduct events, programs and activities impacting various themes and audiences.
- Create legacy projects including publications, memorials, souvenirs, and oral histories.
- Co-brand with local organizations and businesses planning activities in 2023.
- Utilize all forms of communication including an active website and presence on social media.




GOVERNANCE & LEADERSHIP

- Dover 400 Committee established in 2017 by City Council vote with 16 members as a standing city committee.
- In 2019 it became clear that city rules regarding RFPs/RFQs and the bidding process would seriously hamper the committee's ability to be nimble and responsive.
- The Committee decided to pursue non-profit 503c status through 2020.
 Committee dissolved in January 2021 and reformed as Dover 400.
- Executive Director hired in 2000 and majority of logistic work and decisions handled by Project Management Team
