- What does it really mean to be a resilient community from a social, economic, and sustainable point of view?
- How can planners be proactive rather than always in a reactive position?
- What can planners do both in the short-term and for long-term planning efforts? What have been your best practices?
- If you have a session proposal that is unrelated to the theme, we welcome your idea as well.

Session Formats

We look forward to offering conference attendees a highly engaging conference experience. We strongly encourage session proposals and formats that: share and prioritize lessons learned; inspire attendees with a new way of thinking about or doing the work of planning; are solutions-based and offer meaningful take-aways; and engage attendees in brainstorming and problem-solving. The Committee is seeking a diverse mix of session types and lengths for our program. Sessions may be in any of the following formats:

- Presentation with Q&A (engage the audience)
- Panel Discussion
- Rapid, Multi-part presentation (i.e. pecha kucha, "shorts")
- Peer-to-peer Discussion
- Another new or innovative format
