House Bills

In Committee

H. 159 - Better Places Program - The House Committee on Commerce and Economic Development will spend most of the week on this bill. No details were available but [the committee agenda](#) indicates this will now become the Committee's Economic Development Bill. Discussion begins at 9 AM on Tuesday 3/9, resumes at 10:30 AM on Wednesday and through the remainder of the week.

Senate Bills

In Committee

S.33 – Project-based TIF – Continued discussion in Senate Economic Development and Housing Committee on Wednesday (March 10) at 8:30am.

S.66 - Electric Bicycles - Senate Transportation Committee will walk through the bill at 11:30 AM on Tuesday March 8. On Wednesday 9 AM the Committee will hear about the MyRide Microtransit Pilot (Montpelier).

S.101 - Smart Growth Housing/Municipal Bylaw Bill - Senator Sirotkin will discuss the bill with the Senate Natural Resources & Energy Committee on Tuesday (March 9) at 11:45am. The bill is currently in the Senate Economic Development & Housing Committee, and is on their agenda to be discussed again on Wednesday (March 10) at 9:40am. It's listed as "21-0090 - An act relating to promoting housing choice" on the Economic Development & Housing Committee agenda.

Climate Caucus and Council

The Climate Caucus, despite having the date scheduled on their website, did not meet last week. It was town meeting break week for the legislature. Their next meeting is March 18 at noon.

The next meeting of the full Climate Council is March 22 at 8:30 a.m. The Consensus Building Institute is hired as their facilitation consultant. They are also working for Maine and NY state on their climate action plans. At this point VPA's main interest will be in the Council's draft recommendations, to be distributed for public feedback in June. Reports on the Climate Council are likely to be less frequent until then.
